Board of Directors

General Bylaw – 6 – Number and Power

6.1 – Affairs of the Federation shall be managed by a board of eight directors who may exercise all powers and do all acts and things which may be exercised or done by the Federation and which are not by the Letters of Patent or bylaws of the Federation or by law expressly directed or required to be done by the Federation at any annual or special general meeting of the members.

General Bylaw – 10 – Term of Office

10.1 – The Director's term of office shall be for two years from the annual meeting at which he or she is elected or until his or her successor are elected. A person appointed by the director then in office shall hold office for the balance of the unexpired term of the board. A maximum of three consecutive terms may be served by any one director.



On August 30, we had the pleasure of involving many of them in a square dance at the 8th Hussars Center, with many of the adults who were with them, joining in. Altogether, it was an evening of fun.

The local **4H** club, as well as other clubs, were instrumental in bringing a group of International exchange students, along with their host families, to a weekly dance. From this, we hope to have some new dancers for at least the rest of the dance year. These exchange students have come from: China, Germany, Italy, Columbia and Peru and all, except the students from South America, are high school students. They have expressed a desire to continue with the Square and Round dancing till the end of the dance season.

Sussex Corner Dance Club does not recruit dancers through a "class system" but rather on a "start whenever you want to" basis, so we have devised a different system for graduating dancers. When a new dancer has reached a level of competence in Basic and Mainstream, we give that dancer a club badge, so that dancer can dance at other clubs and to other callers if they wish, then once a year we have a Graduation dance where they all receive their certificates of graduation. This is the first year for this system. Our graduation dance will be held on April 7, 2017.

The total this year was \$4516.80 bringing us to a grand total of \$89,217. We are aiming for \$100,000 before retiring this annual dance.






