Board of Directors

General Bylaw – 6 – Number and Power

6.1 – Affairs of the Federation shall be managed by a board of eight directors who may exercise all powers and do all acts and things which may be exercised or done by the Federation and which are not by the Letters of Patent or bylaws of the Federation or by law expressly directed or required to be done by the Federation at any annual or special general meeting of the members.

General Bylaw – 10 – Term of Office

10.1 – The Director's term of office shall be for two years from the annual meeting at which he or she is elected or until his or her successor are elected. A person appointed by the director then in office shall hold office for the balance of the unexpired term of the board. A maximum of three consecutive terms may be served by any one director.


Sets in Order

Sets in Order Square Dance Magazine printed its final copy with the December 1985 issue after 37 years and 444 consecutive issues. It was a quality magazine devoted to just square dancing. The name came from the fact that in the early years, callers would start a square dance with "sets in order". This was the signal to bring dancers to the floor.

This magazine contained where to dance, who was calling, where you could buy the proper attire, caller information on equipment and even workshop instructions, and so much more. While it was an American publication, it seemed to cover the world, with conventions as far away as China. It also included the First Annual Square Dance Convention in Alberta. The price of this magazine started at 75 cents.

During a beginner class, the editor notice a member "doodling" with paper and pencil between the tips. Frank Grundeen, who was an artist that had worked for Walt Disney, signed on to the magazine as the cartoonist. He continued providing cartoons for the magazine, in all 444 issues. Below is one of his cartoons from the October 1978 issue.



Fox Family at Mount Terry Fox Dedication Ceremony – 1981

Dear Frank:

It could be said that our family has lived in the "cancer world" for close to four decades but we realized last year, when our dad was diagnosed with lung cancer, that our experience had been mostly peripheral. We never witnessed the impact of Adriamycin and Methotrexate on our brother Terry – he would not allow us to see his pain and suffering. He would check himself into the BC Cancer Agency clinic for his chemo treatments and leave only when he had fully recovered.

With Dad we took it all in; we were there for every appointment, doctor meetings and radiation treatment. The 200,000 Canadians diagnosed each year with cancer became so much more personal; each number represented a life, important and connected to family and friends. We witnessed those connections, the love and the hope. And yes, there was hope. In fact, we could feel hope everywhere. Despite his frail health, advancing age and a Stage 4 diagnosis, Dad still reached for the opportunities to extend his life that were potentially available to him. Unfortunately, he did not test positive for the EGFR mutation and the *Personalized Onco-Genomics Program* available to patients with metastatic disease. Yet, your contribution to The Terry Fox Foundation gave our Dad, and everyone facing a cancer diagnosis, HOPE.

Hope was a big word for Terry. He left the cancer ward full of hope, believing research had increased his chances of surviving cancer. It lived in every step he took and every mile he ran on the Marathon of Hope. Today, 36 years later, you create and sustain hope with everything you do in your extraordinary fundraising effort. Please convey our thanks to all your generous donors for the faith they show in the work of the Foundation.

Our admiration for what you do each year in Terry's name knows no bounds. Thank you so very much.
