Please note that this price will be in effect to all people renewing their subscriptions from this day forward. If you have recently renewed, you do nothing until your current subscription runs out.

As well, the third and probably the most forward thinking idea, is that our **Journal** will be available for all to see on our website which can be found at the following: www.squaredancenb.ca Just look under the heading "Journal" and you will find the latest copy and past issues of the Journal there. This will be a free service for any and all. So if you do not wish to renew your Journal, you can view it on the web at any time. You can print off those pages that pertain only to what you want and when you want it. There will also be color as well on our web version. We are at the point in our lives where we realize that not everyone views a book or a paper copy of anything anymore and they look for their information on the web. 



Federation of Dance Clubs of New Brunswick, Inc. Directors and Year Started

Board of Directors General Bylaw – 6 – Number and Power

6.1 – Affairs of the Federation shall be managed by a board of eight directors who may exercise all powers and do all acts and things which may be exercised or done by the Federation and which are not by the Letters of Patent or bylaws of the Federation or by law expressly directed or required to be done by the Federation at any annual or special general meeting of the members.

General Bylaw - 10 - Term of Office

10.1 – The Director's term of office shall be for two years from the annual meeting at which he or she is elected or until his or her successor are elected. A person appointed by the director then in office shall hold office for the balance of the unexpired term of the board. A maximum of three consecutive terms may be served by any one director.
