# FROM THE EDITOR'S DESK




Happy New Year everyone!



#### From Behind the Microphone, by Ron Lowe

This is the second in what we hope will be a series of informative columns from our Activity Leaders. We hope the readers see value and ask to see the presentations continue.

#### HOW TO BE A TEAM PLAYER:

When we step into a square to dance, each of us takes on the roll of a team player, in this group of eight dancers. What is your role and what can you do to assure and perhaps improve the dancing experience for all?

Following is a list of simple steps that, with a little effort on your part, will become dancer habits and improve the dancing experience for all. When joining a square, ask yourself the questions below:

1. Am I in a head or a side position? This is also referred to as 1&3 and 2&4.

2. Who is my partner? See, I told you this would be easy.

3. What is my couple number -1, 2, 3 or 4?

4. Am I dancing in the man or woman position? Often in today's dance world we take on different roles. If so, are others aware? Tags/badges do help.

5. Who is my corner? Opposite? Knowing who your corner is can be a big help, especially as they progressively sequence in a singing call figure.

Then, listen for the music to start and be prepared to act, as the first call may be for you.

Touching hands with adjacent dancers can help to affirm your current position.

The square "breathes" as we dance, so do what you can to keep it from losing definition or growing too large.

Generally speaking, do not extend your hands to the point that your elbows are more than four inches (10 cm) from your sides. DO NOT reach out, dance into the position or hand hold.

Keep the shoulders of the inside dancers in close proximity, especially during promenades, both on the inside and around the perimeter of the square.

Dance your part and be in your position, as this is often the best way to help others. Sometimes you can get great info by observing your position counterpart in the other squares.

When attempting to assist other dancers, DO NOT physically turn them unless they may be in danger of falling or being tripped, as usually the Leader will be watching the people and can offer assistance. An extended hand, a point or a quick whisper, often suffices. If you feel that more direction is required, ask the Caller to offer assistance, usually <u>after the tip is ended</u>.

In summary, the experienced dancers can and often do, provide a great environment for newer or less experienced dancers to grow. If you are a newer dancer, learn to evaluate your dancing experiences and measure your abilities. Follow the simple guidelines as listed above and allow yourself time to learn - from dancing, dancing, dancing, every place and every time you can. Once again, knowing your part, as a team player, is the best action you can take to improve the dancing experience for all. I strongly feel that most square breakdowns can be avoided. Read the Call list for the level you are dancing and self evaluate your abilities. Leave the rest to the leaders, as we are always here to help.

#### **OROMOCTO PIONEERS 50TH ANNIVERSARY**

On Saturday, December 8<sup>th</sup>, the Oromocto Pioneers celebrated their 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary as a square dance club with a very successful dance at the Oromocto High School.

The Oromocto Pioneers Square Dance Club was formed in the summer and fall of 1968. The club was formed because of the interest of several military families who had enjoyed the art of square dancing across Canada and even while posted overseas in Germany. They started dancing at Waasis Road Junior High School (now known as Ridgeview Middle School) with caller Warren Hawkins. In the 1983-1984 season, they moved to the Oromocto High School where they still dance today. Warren Hawkins, the first club caller, along with his lovely wife, Barbara, put the first class of twenty-six dancers through the basic movements of square dancing. All twenty-six dancers graduated on April 23<sup>rd</sup>, 1969. Barbara Hawkins, the first caller's wife, still resides in the area. George Henwood, from the original graduating class, still dances regularly with the Elm Tree Squares. The club has performed many dances at special events as well as holding their own special dances. This was a way for them to keep up their dancing skills and to build lasting friendships with other square dancers. The club still hosts special dances and at times attends special events. Many callers have helped the Oromocto Pioneers reach this fifty-year milestone. Past callers include Warren Hawkins, Bob Dempsey, John Canney, Bill Howe and Terry Hebert. The present caller is Gerry O'Hara who has been calling for the club for twenty-nine years (1984-1988 and 1993-2018).

The Oromocto Pioneers were pleased to have over one hundred and forty dancers attend the anniversary dance on Saturday. The dancers represented twenty clubs from New Brunswick, Nova Scotia and Prince Edward Island. At times there were fourteen squares on the dance floor!!! Laurie Bishop was the main cuer along with guest cuer, Beth Dickinson (Nova Scotia). Gerry O'Hara was the main caller along with guest callers Terry Hebert (Elm Tree Squares), Laurie Illsley (Nova Scotia), Roger Sherren (Prince Edward Island) and Ron Lowe (Beaus and Belles).

Special guests who attended the dance were Mary Wilson (present member of the legislative assembly for Oromocto, Lincoln and Fredericton), Jody Carr (past member of the legislative assembly), Bob Powell (mayor of Oromocto), Eric and Dianne McCormack (Society presidents and National Representatives for New Brunswick), Mike and Gerry Lefebvre (Federation presidents and provincial representatives), Jim and Pat McLean (Callers Association representatives) and Anna and Roger Sherren (presidents of the New Brunswick and Prince Edward Island Callers Association). Certificates were presented by the guests to the Oromocto Pioneers presidents, John and Sharon Eldridge, in honour of the club's 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary.

Two extra special guests who also attended the celebration dance were George Henwood, a member of the first graduating class of the Oromocto Pioneers in 1969 and Hazel Fraser, a member of the second verv graduating class in 1970. George and Hazel added to the festivities of the evening by cutting the anniversary cake. George was presented with a certificate for being part of the first graduating class.

Gerry O'Hara, who has been the caller for the Pioneers consecutively for the past twenty-five years, will be retiring at the end of this year. We also had seven (7) cancer survivors come forward and be recognized with a survivor's T-shirt.






