FROM THE EDITOR'S DESK




Spring is here regardless of what the groundhog said. Time for shaking off the winter blues and looking forward to warmer weather!



From Behind the Microphone by Chris Ayres

Teaching and Timing

This sounds like two subjects but really it isn't. It is two segments of the same subject, "learning to dance". If we danced perfectly, (which no one does), the steps would be done perfectly and the timing would be exactly with the music. Having said all that, let's take a look at teaching.

If we belong to a club that has classes once or twice a year, we usually have some class Angels and these dancers make things so much easier for the Teacher, but still there are some rules and methods that even they must follow: (1) no talking while the Caller is calling or teaching, a gentle touch or a point to a facing direction or place, is enough, if that doesn't do it, it is up to the teacher to correct the learner. (2) to do everything "according to the book" while the class is learning, i.e. no frills, no hop/ skip and jump to start the right and left grand, no swings in a grand square and no extra swing to begin, or end, a promenade, unless the teacher asks for it, and no extra twirls. All these little extras are nice and make the square look better if they are done with the music but there is no place for them in a teach, and the learners will pick them up quickly enough after they have learned, if they want to!

If we belong to a club that takes new people any time during the dance year, the same things apply, but the newcomers are far more likely to be dancing with dancers in the square who are themselves not very good at some of the things being taught. This makes it doubly important for the "good" dancers in the square, if any, to lead by example, and these "good" dancers must still remember the above rules, although quite often they can help with a few words in between tips. One of the things I have found during my teaching and calling career, is that the dancers who graduated the year before, or in the last class, are helped tremendously by becoming class Angels to help others who know less than they do.

Now, let us take a look at timing. Timing is a part of square dancing that is often regarded as not too important, and many think it is secondary to knowing the steps, but, that is wrong. Any dancer who has danced in a square that has kept time with the music through a long figure or a tip, knows how much more enjoyment there is to "dancing to the music". It can give a dancer the feeling, when the tip is over, of WOW, we really did dance that one!!! If you have been in a square that has rushed to finish a Grand Square, or any other figure and then stood waiting at the end, you know then, that "that" is not dancing!

During the Summer of 1975, Charlie attended the "House of Roth" Caller School, run by Johnny and Gloria Roth near the town of Digby, NS. Attending this same Caller School were: Art Capson, Kerry Fletcher, Jim Alquire and John Medicraft, among others.

Charlie taught classes in Sussex in 1977, 78, and 79. These classes consisted of about four squares, and in 1979 he took over the "Peti-Partners" club from Ches McKay.

He also Called for the Sussex "Kennebec Aces" square dance club from 1986 to 1994. In 1990 Charlie moved the Peti-Partners Club from the School building where they danced, between Petitcodiac and Havelock, to the Workshop behind his house to save on expenses. Charlie had put an expansion on to his "one car" garage to make room for up to 5 squares, where the dancers learned to keep "tight" squares. When the club moved to this location, there were one to two squares in the club and Charlie built the club up to three to four squares, five on special occasions.

Two of Charlie's Brothers became Callers; Robert who Cued occasionally to the Peti-Partners and Frank who learned to Call and called in the Fredericton area.

Charlie continued to Call into the Spring of 2009 to the club in his Workshop/Dancehall every Thursday, from the Basic to the Plus Level, with two to four squares attending. His workshop was also used by the NB Caller's Association for their meetings, except during the coldest months.

Board of Directors General Bylaw – 6 – Number and Power

6.1 – Affairs of the Federation shall be managed by a board of eight directors who may exercise all powers and do all acts and things which may be exercised or done by the Federation and which are not by the Letters of Patent or bylaws of the Federation or by law expressly directed or required to be done by the Federation at any annual or special general meeting of the members.

General Bylaw – 10 – Term of Office

10.1 – The Director's term of office shall be for two years from the annual meeting at which he or she is elected or until his or her successor are elected. A person appointed by the director then in office shall hold office for the balance of the unexpired term of the board. A maximum of three consecutive terms may be served by any one director.
