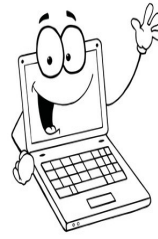

You can do them all it's up to you.

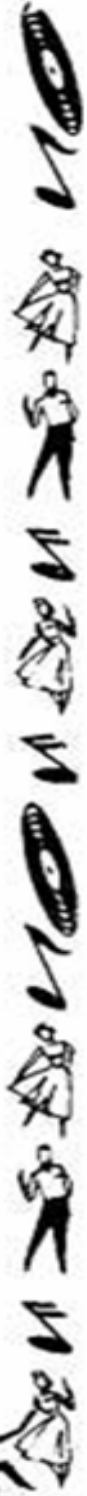
We take a break and have a chat

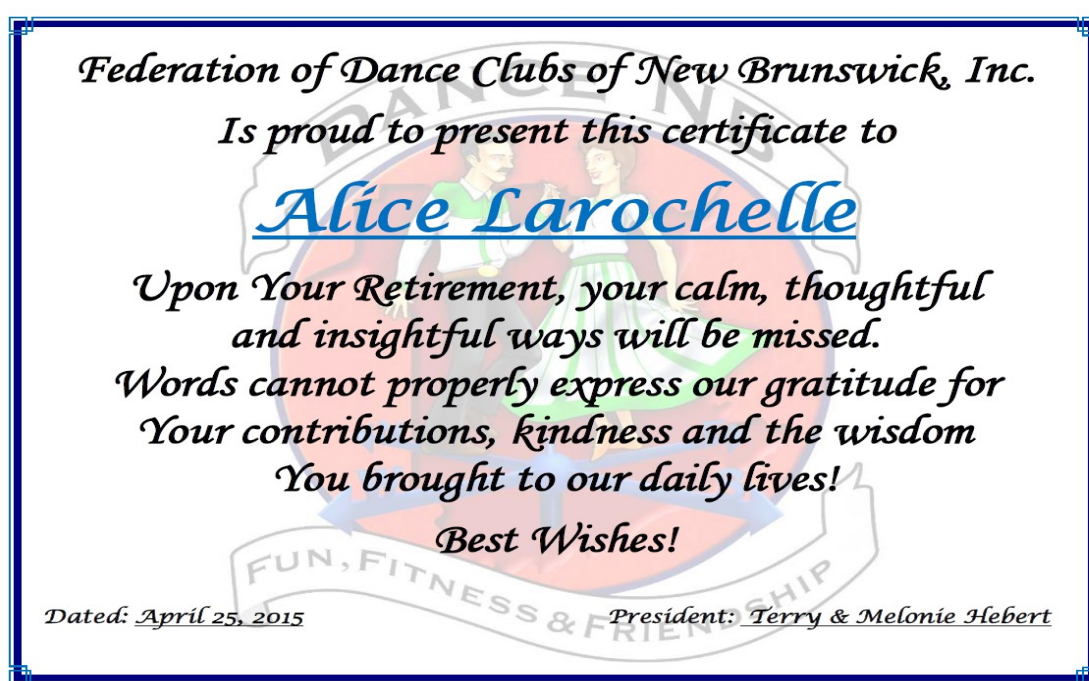
Certificates of Recognition

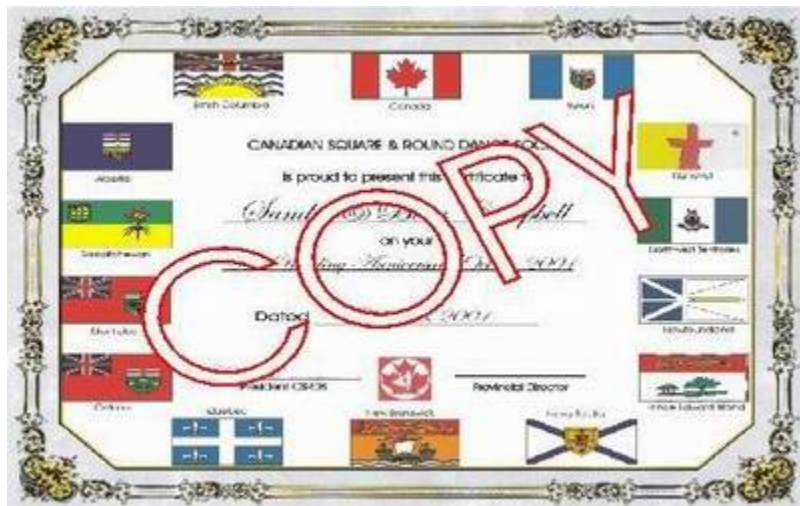

From behind the Microphone, by Ron Lowe

Let's continue, in what we hope will be a series of informative columns from our local Activity Leaders. We hope the readers see value and ask to see the presentations continue.

Topic: The new 12 lesson 50 Call, SSD plan:

When I first learned to dance, back in '68, the list of calls required to become a graduate dancer was a bit shorter. Over the years many new calls were developed and presented for dancers to try. Several of those were added to the list of suggested calls a dancer should know and be taught, prior to entering the broader square dance world as a new graduate dancer. Other calls were actually dropped from the original mainstream list but for the most part, the actual number of calls required to become a graduate mainstream dancer, has not changed enough to have any real impact on the final result.

As we often attempt to introduce smaller numbers of interested people, the task of preparing newer dancers for graduation and entrance into our activity is more difficult than in years gone by. Separate class teaching sessions are often not feasible. Therefore, Clubs/Callers are attempting to teach newer dancers on the same night as the regular club dances. This means less floor time on any given evening for new dancers to practice their skills. (It also means less dance time for graduates to enhance their skills)

For many years now, most teachers would suggest that thirty weeks of two hour sessions is required to teach the current program. Do the quick math and you will need three dance seasons (years) to provide the same amount of floor time, That is, if you only teach new dancers during the regular club night dance time periods. Still, most Clubs want to graduate dancers sooner. One season is often still considered the traditional time period.

I suggest we consider other options to help our new folks. Maybe once a month have an all class teaching evening. Maybe add an extra fifteen minutes or half an hour to the regular sessions? Maybe once a month we need a Saturday class session, open to all new dancers in the area. If you really want new dancers to join us, please keep an open mind and work to come up with other viable options. That is all I ask.

All that being said...Leaders continue to search for a more compact program for square dance clubs/callers to follow. It has been a continuing struggle to come up with an answer. SSD 50 list and program is the latest attempt, and does have potential. But, many believe, myself included, that it may require future tweaking, as we strive towards the best fit for our activity in the very busy and time conscious world of 2020.

I say, let's give it a try!

We always enjoy having company join us on Friday nights. Woodstock Wheelers came down on June 21 to steal our banner.

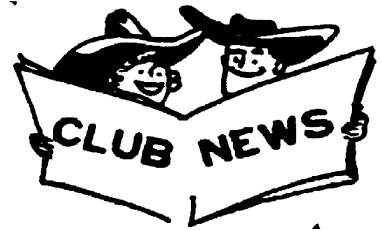

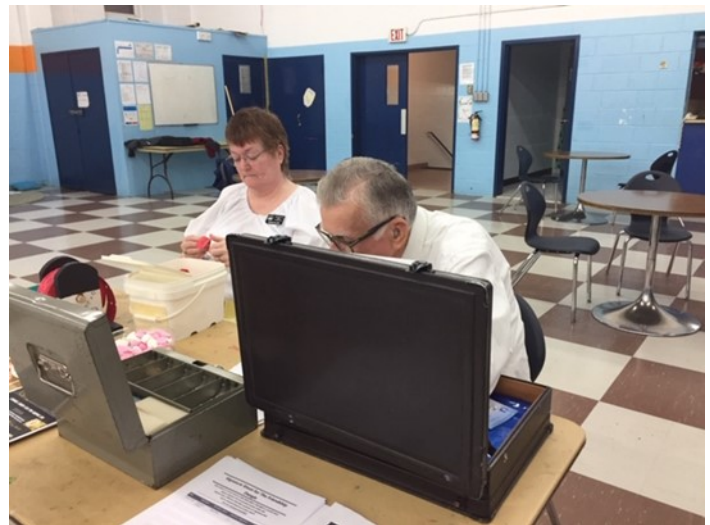

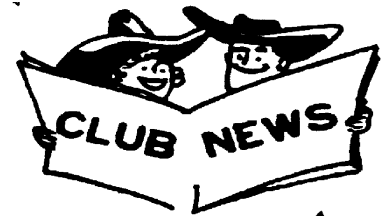

Traditions Traditions Matter.

Frank Sonnenberg writes

“Traditions represent a critical piece of our culture. They help form the structure and foundation of our families and our society. They remind us that we are part of a history that defines our past, shapes whom we are today and whom we are likely to become. Once we ignore the meaning of our traditions, we are in danger of damaging the underpinning of our identity.”

Traditions guide us every day in everything we do - holidays, family and even Square Dancing.

I, for one, am saddened by the tendency of dancers to drift away from Square Dance traditions and I see it everywhere we go to dance.

What ever happened to Square Dance attire? Only twelve years ago when we first started dancing, we were drawn to the beautiful skirts, flowing crinolines, collar dogs, bolos, belt buckles and bows. What ever happened to men wearing long sleeve shirts, door greeters and yellow rocks?

We can use all the excuses we like as to the reasons why some of our square dance traditions have faded into obscurity, but the fact remains we are losing our identity, part of the history that reminds us of our past.

The tradition of dressing in Square Dance attire contributes a sense of comfort and belonging. It makes us proud to be a part of this wonderful activity we call square dancing. It provides a forum to showcase, to be role models and a portal to celebrate dance. It allows us to showcase the principles of our activity founders and bonds us together as belonging to a unique group.

You will not see the Scottish dancers without their kilts or proud First Nations people celebrate their culture without being dressed in regalia appropriate to the occasion. Why is it “ok” to mock our activity by dancing in street clothes?

Now, I look out onto the floor and see short sleeve shirts, sneakers, jeans, slacks and even shorts. Same thing I can see if I were standing on the corner of Main and First Streets downtown. At the last dance we attended, my wife and I were the only dancers in full square dance attire, and we felt alienated, like we did not belong.

We feel that we must utilize every opportunity available to us to reinforce the values and beliefs that we hold close to our hearts. The alternative to action is to take these values for granted. If we continue to disregard these values, we will open our eyes one day to traditions unrecognizable and the original fabric of our activity will be torn to a point of no return.

Could this be one of the reasons dancers have drifted off into obscurity?

We might just as well toss away our square dance clothes and head down to the local community center on a Saturday night to dance.

Our intolerance to these traditional changes in our activity is rooted in our fear that Square Dancing as we knew it will vanish along with the values and identities that are part of its history. Then again, we cannot expect others to abandon their values any more than we would forsake our own and we respect that.

Consider that we are losing our identity, the uniqueness of our activity that makes us stand out from the crowd, the feeling of being “special”.

I am sure that there are many root causes and consequences to this rapid erosion of our square dance traditions and to analyze and study these may or may not have any influence toward saving them. My voice may be trivial and taken as a rant, but at least I have planted a seed in voicing my disapproval of the road this has taken and given you all food for thought.

See you on the dance floor. We will be the dancers wearing Square Dance attire and yes, we love our hugs.

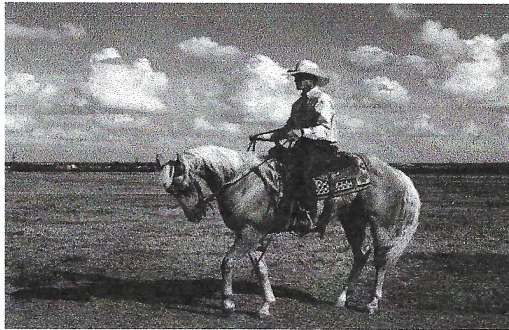

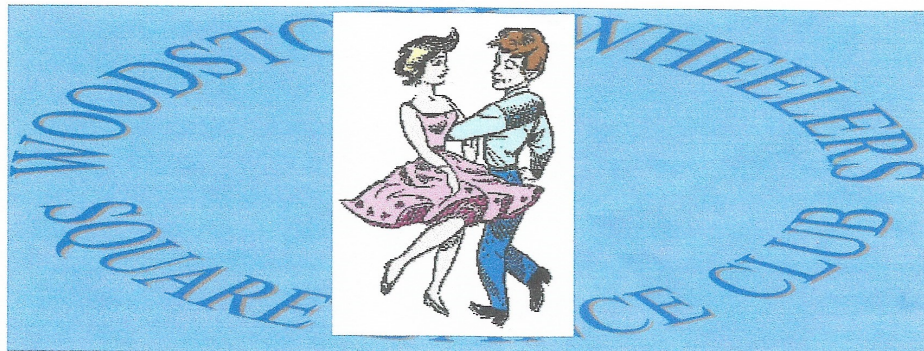

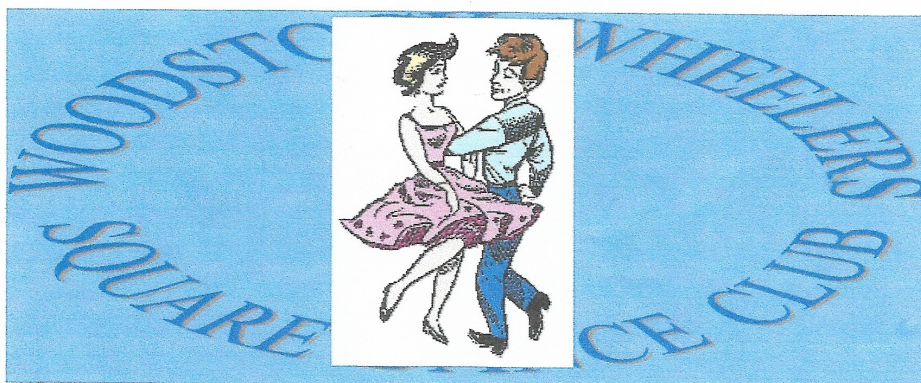

Board of Directors

General Bylaw – 6 – Number and Power

6.1 – Affairs of the Federation shall be managed by a board of eight directors who may exercise all powers and do all acts and things which may be exercised or done by the Federation and which are not by the Letters of Patent or bylaws of the Federation or by law expressly directed or required to be done by the Federation at any annual or special general meeting of the members.

General Bylaw – 10 – Term of Office

10.1 – The Director's term of office shall be for two years from the annual meeting at which he or she is elected or until his or her successor are elected. A person appointed by the director then in office shall hold office for the balance of the unexpired term of the board. A maximum of three consecutive terms may be served by any one director.
